



Each year, Willits Frontier Days gives back to the community in the form of donations and financial support for local activities and programs.

During a March 2015 meeting, \$2,500 was given back as follows: Little Lake Fire Department received \$250 for their smoke detector program; Soroptimist International of Willits received \$200 for their PEG program and \$250 for their book project; the Willits High School Swim Team received \$300 for new equipment; and the TRAIL program at Ridgewood Ranch received \$1.000.

Willits Frontier Days also donated \$500 for two full scholarships and one half scholarship for a three-day science camp at the Mendocino Coast this summer that sixth-grade students at Baechtel Grove Middle School were invited to attend. More than 100 students were invited, and each student needs to raise \$200 to attend.

The California Cowboys Pro Rodeo Association is a group of top-ranked cowgirls and cowboys who participate on a circuit of professional-grade rodeos throughout the state.

The contestants participate in eight events – bareback, saddle bronc, team roping, calf roping, steer wrestling, breakaway roping, barrel racing and bull riding – hoping to win the coveted All-Around title. After the points from all the events are tallied, the cowgirl and cowboy with the highest cumulative scores win the title, coordinating engraved buckle created at Outlaw Saddlery, a wad of cold hard cash and bragging rights for the duration of the year.


The livestock for the events, the bulls, broncs and horned-alike – 'rodeo stock' as they are referred to in the trade –are provided by Humboldt County's Lou Bugenig and Mike Mora of West Coast Rodeos. Known throughout the state as premiere stock contractors, West Coast bulls and broncs give the boys a challenge to hang on to, and the steer and calves try to give the ladies a run for their money.

In addition to the eight CCPRA rodeo events, cowboys and cowgirls from Lake, Mendocino and Humboldt counties can compete in local team roping events as well. Trophy buckles, also engraved by Outlaw Saddlery, are awarded to the top scoring Header and Heeler.


FRANK R. HOWARD MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

Celebrating Willits Frontier Days



IN 1925 the Willits Development Association began discussing the need for a modern hospital. Working with the American Legion Post #174, they sponsored an old fashioned celebration on the 4th of July. The proceeds were designated for the building of a Willits Community Hospital. Charles S. Howard, owner of a nearby ranch (and 10 years

later the owner of the famed racehorse Seabiscuit), was the first Grand Marshall of the Frontier Days Parade. Just two months before the second annual Frontier Days, Charles Howard's 15-year-old, Frank R. Howard, was injured in a serious automobile accident. Because of the seriousness of Frank's injuries, he was unable to
