The 14th annual Pure Mendocino fundraiser took place August 25 at Dark Horse Ranch just outside Ukiah. Pure Mendocino is the biggest fundraiser of the year for the Cancer Resource Centers of Mendocino County, and celebrates the healthy community created around Mendocino County's organic and biodynamic farms, vineyards and ranches.

The event, which includes appetizers and wine tasting, a sit-down, family-style organic dinner, silent auction with live music and dancing was hosted by honorary chair Paul Dolan and attended by approximately 300 guests. Music for the evening this year was provided by a local band, The Back Porch Project, which donated its services to the cause.

The Cancer Resource Centers of Mendocino County is a local, grassroots nonprofit agency that provides information, support and advocacy to anyone with cancer in Mendocino County, free of charge. Its work is supported completely through donations, fundraising, and grants. CRC has two offices: an inland office at 590 S. Dora Street in Ukiah, and a coastal office on Calpella Street in Mendocino. The vision of the Cancer Resource Center is that no one in Mendocino County will face cancer alone.

"I want to thank all of the volunteers, sponsors, supporters, donors, and guests who made this event such a success," said Karen Oslund, executive director of the Cancer Resource Centers. "This event is critical to funding our work." Oslund explains that grants come and go, and recently one of

SWOONING AND CROONING Jazz duet blends Big Band sound with classical orchestra By Roberta Werdinger

The Ukiah Symphony Orchestra opens its 2018-19 season with playful panache on the weekend of September 8 and 9 with a Big Band-themed concert, "Kick Off Your Shoes!" The concert reunites popular local songstress Roseanne Wetzel with Bay Area crooner Pedro Rodelas for a celebration of an important part of the Great American Songbook.

Vocalist Pedro Rodelas welcomes the opportunity to extend his repertoire by performing songs in the style of Sinatra, along with duets including "The Girl from Ipanema" with Wetzel. He jokes that his role is "the ultimate karaoke" with the orchestra providing most of the heavy lifting.

Although it is true the orchestra will be well-prepared for the occasion, with conductor Les Pfutzenreuter increasing the brass section (saxophones, trumpets, and trombones) and providing prominent roles for piano, bass, drums and guitar, Rodelas will more than hold his own.

Trained as an opera singer with a master's degree in vocal performance from the University of Maryland, Rodelas studied acting, scene design, and several languages in order to become the "well rounded singer and actor" that the opera world requires.

While opera remains a great love of Rodelas's – he sings with the San Francisco Opera Chorus, among other vocal gigs – he enjoys the playfulness and lightness of mood that Big Band music conveys so well.

Roseanne Wetzel also carries a wealth of talent and enthusiasm over from other parts of the musical spectrum. Wetzel is a graduate of Ukiah's SPACE program as well as the San Francisco School of the Arts. She has performed in musical theater from a young age and continues to do so in and around Ukiah, when she is not performing with her new "folkgrass" band called the Back Porch Project, or presiding behind the desk at the Ukiah Library.

Wetzel and Rodelas have sung together accompanied by the Ukiah Symphony for such favorites as "Annie Get Your Gun," and "South Pacific."

"I get to showcase a different part of my personality every time I go onstage," Wetzel comments, noting - like Rodelas – that she enjoys the chance to sing without being in the guise of a character. Since her childhood watching old musicals on TV, Wetzel has loved Big Band music, commenting, "I'm looking forward to getting into the swing of it with Pedro." Rodelas assents, adding that he's eager to break the "fourth wall" between singer (or crooner) and audience, engaging folks in banter and receiving instant feedback. All that, and an orchestra too.

SONOMA CLEAN POWER LAUNCHES **Final EV Incentive**

Program

Sonoma Clean Power, the public electricity provider for Sonoma and Mendocino counties, recently announced the launch of their third and final electric vehicle incentive program, along with an updated brand identity and new website

"The program is back with a new look, to better reflect our service territory, which now includes Mendocino County, but with the same great incentives on electric cars and home chargers," said Kate Kelly, SCP's director of public affairs and marketing.

The Drive EV program, in its third and final year, will run from now through November 16. 2018, and offers incentives up to \$4,000 exclusively for SCP customers. Additional manufacturer and dealer discounts, rebates, and tax credits may also be available.

The program will be communicated in English and Spanish via direct mail, print, digital and outdoor advertising, radio, TV, social media and other mediums. SCP customers can get started by applying at www.DriveEV.org.

"We are extremely proud of the transformative nature of the Drive EV program, which has already helped 800 families get discounted electric cars and provided 1,900 home chargers over the past two years," said SCP CEO, Geof Syphers. "Drive EV is one example of the innovative and practical programs we've been able to provide customers. Bulk discounts on electric vehicles are helping us address climate change by making these high-performance cars more affordable."

SCP extended its popular free EV home charging station program through June 2019, but they're not stopping there. After the completion of the Drive EV program, the agency will focus on growing the public charging network in Sonoma and Mendocino counties to further help the region transition away from gasoline-powered vehicles.

UKIAH HOSPITAL OPENS NEW EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT, ICU AND ROOFTOP HELIPAD ON SEPTEMBER 6

Adventist Health Ukiah Valley invites the community to join us for the grand opening event September 6 to celebrate completion of the new, state-of-the-art Emergency Department, Intensive Care Unit and rooftop helipad.

"After thousands of hours of planning by many individuals. four years of construction, and a challenging regulatory approval process, we're finally ready to share this stateof-the-art critical care facility with you and your family. It feels great to know that with this hospital expansion, we'll be able to take care of our community for decades to come in a world-class Emergency Department and Intensive Care Unit, with the quality of care and privacy our patients and staff deserve," says David Weis, AHUV operations executive.

The new 14,700-square-foot ED is four times as big as the existing space. It has 19 private treatment rooms, including rooms for special types of care such as assessment and triage, psychiatric care, gynecological care, negative pressure rooms for highly infectious patients, and two trauma rooms equipped like mini-operating rooms. Patient flow has been carefully designed so patients brought in by ambulance or helicopter are received through a separate entrance from the public walk-in and drop-off entrance.

For patients who require hospitalization in the ICU, eight critical care rooms are equipped with state-of-the-art technology, natural lighting, and accommodations for loved ones at the bedside. Each ICU room is also equipped with its own temperature control systems to provide for individual control of temperature for the comfort of our patients

As with any project of this size, it takes a team of experts to transform plans into reality. Lionakis designed the building with Herrero Builders as our general contractor for this project. Local contractors like Valley Paving, Peterson and Son's Welding, Wipf Construction, and HL Weaver all played significant roles in the project. "We used local contractors whenever possible," Weis explained.


AHUV President Gwen Matthews commented: "Our new ER and ICU are everything I hoped they would be. I asked our architect to design features that kept the new space from being just a box; I wanted features that would lift our spirits. What I love most about the new space is that it honors the great service that our clinical teams provide as well as those who come here for care with our very best. Today, I see our ER staff make the best of a space that makes it hard to maneuver, even as they save lives with compassionate hearts. I look forward to seeing them thrive in the new space."

The September 6 celebration is set to start at 4:30 pm and includes a ribbon-cutting ceremony at 5:15 pm. The event will include music, hors d'oeuvres and "sneak peek" tours of the new facility, with doors closing at 6:30 pm. Festivities will be held in the new Emergency Department and ICU at 275 Hospital Drive in Ukiah, just behind the existing
